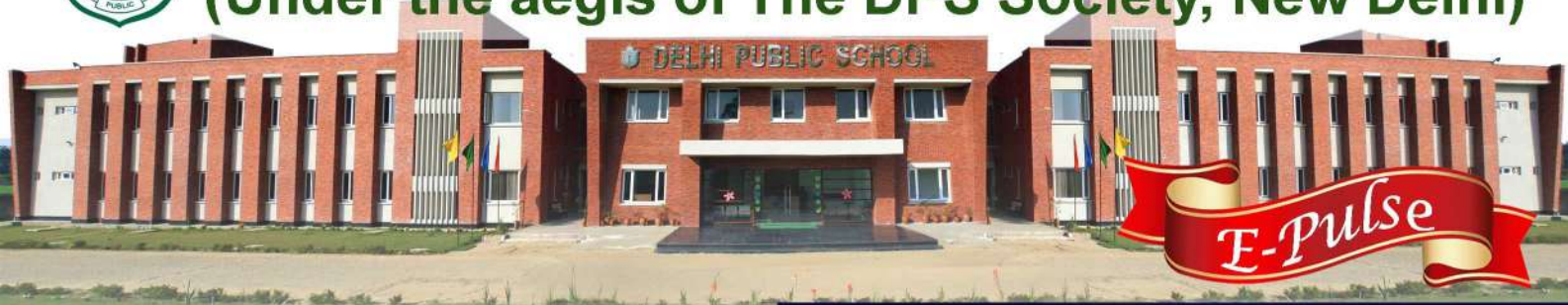

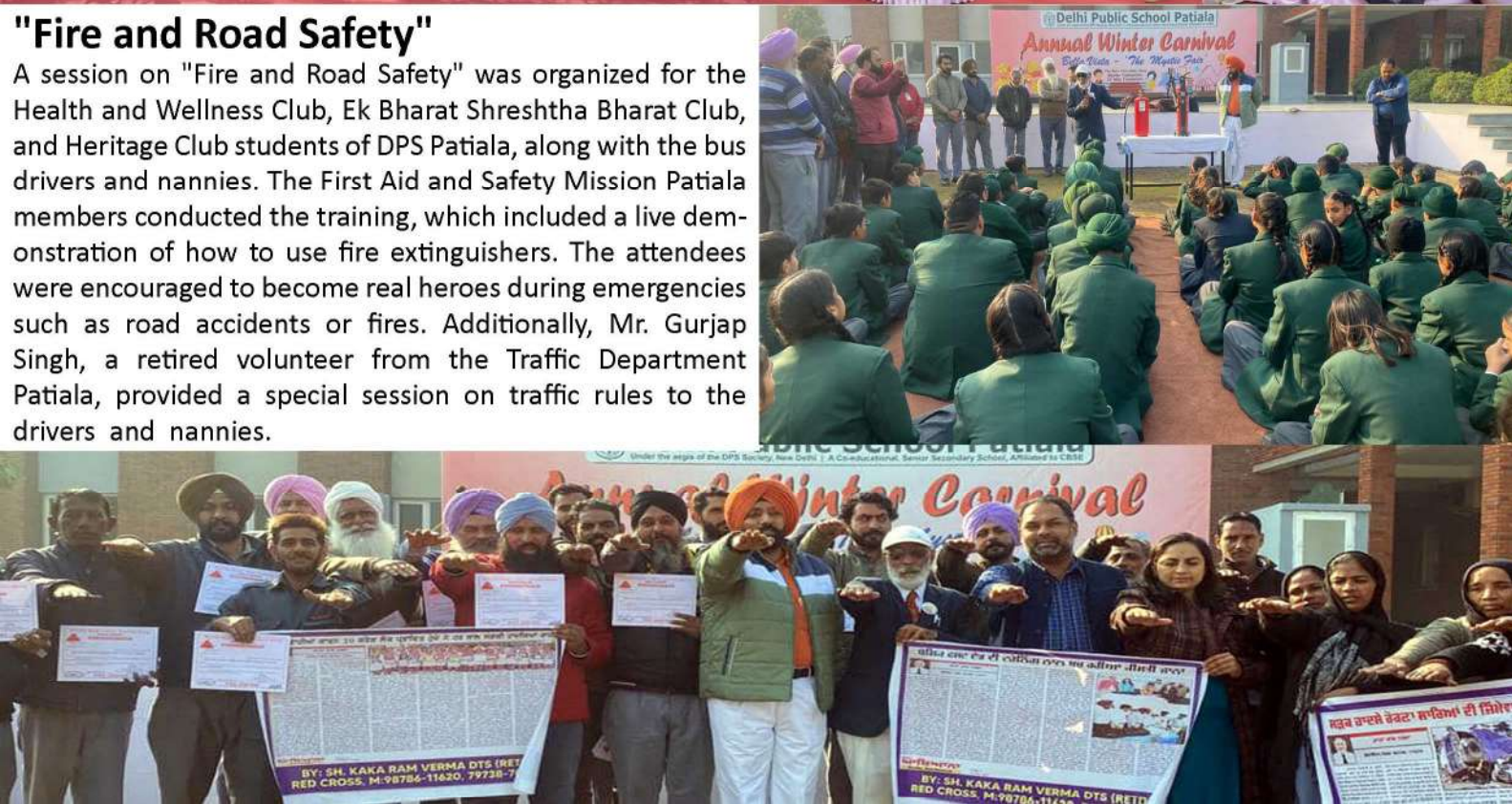
The Annual Winter Carnival Bella Vista-

During the safari, they spotted various animals such as spotted deer, monkeys, alligators, and wild sambhars. Following the safari, the group visited the historic Ranthambore Fort and the Craft Emporium before embarking on their bus ride back to Jaipur and then on to Patiala.



SPIC MACAY North Zone Convention

The North Zone Convention of SPIC MACAY was organised at DPS Ludhiana in February 2023 and was a part of the organization's endeavour to recognise and bring the most accomplished artists of Indian classical music, classical dance, folk, poetry, theatre, traditional paintings, crafts & yoga to the student community in schools and colleges. The 2 day convention was attended by 10 girls of our school on the 4th and 5th February 2023. The grand inauguration of the event was followed by Sitar Recital by Pt. Gaurav Mazumdar.
